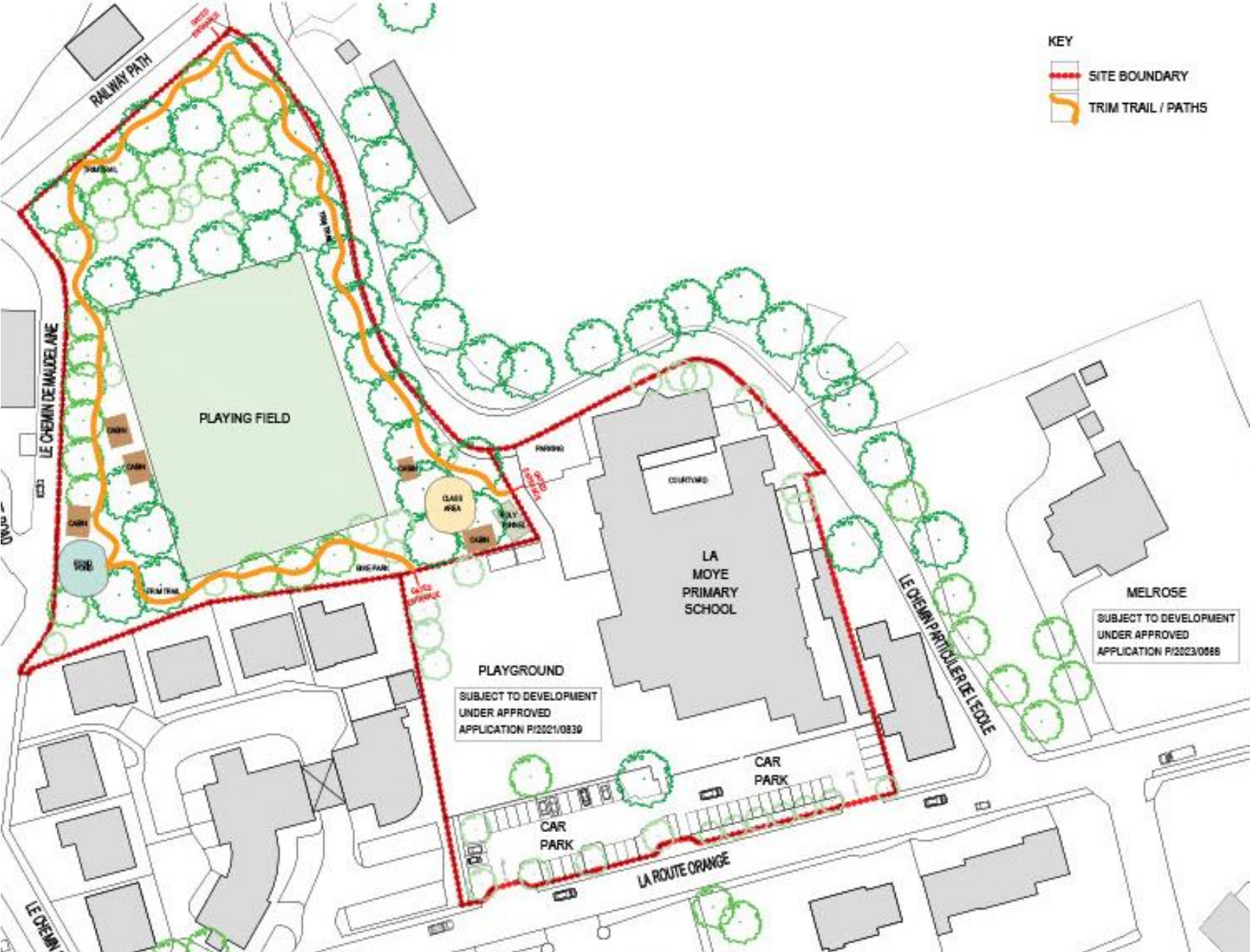


La Moye Primary School – Location Plan



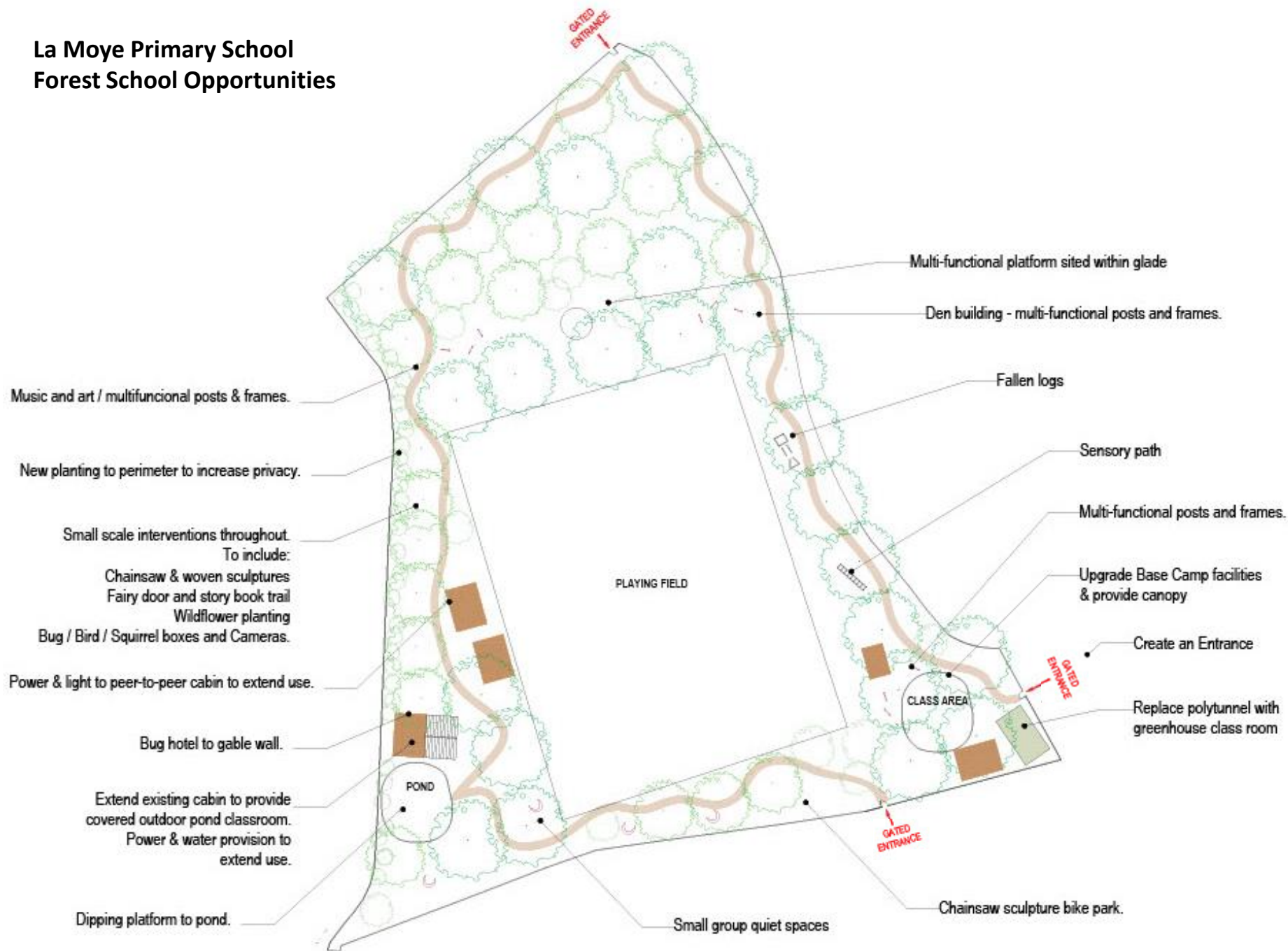

# Base Camp

Base camp – the heart of Forest School - where sessions begin and end with songs, stories or a group activity game. Conversations around the fire circle happen, children cook and play together to strengthen the community feeling of each class.

## Extent of Upgrade & Canopy Options.



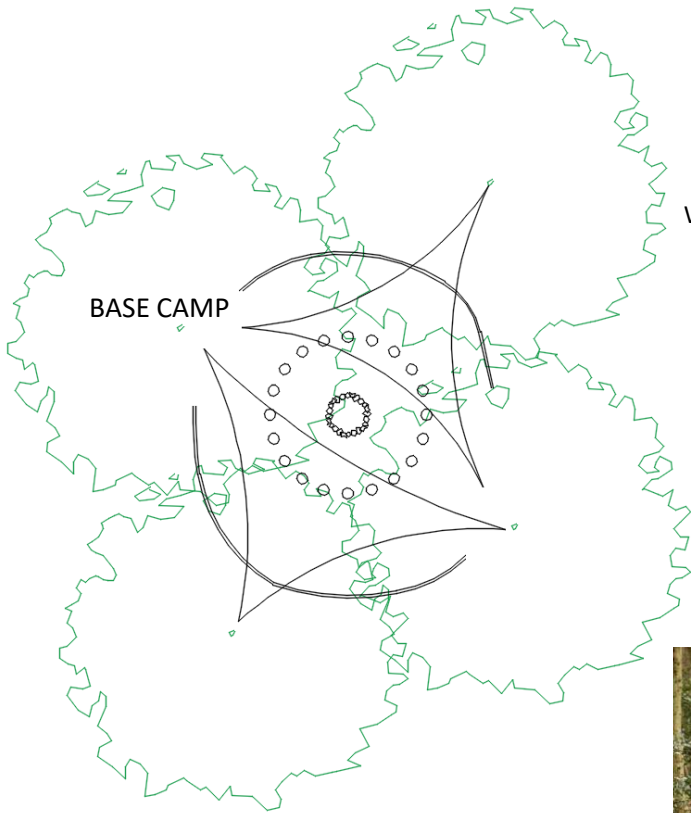
Fixed solid shelter with open firepit and log benches

## Around Base Camp and Entrances



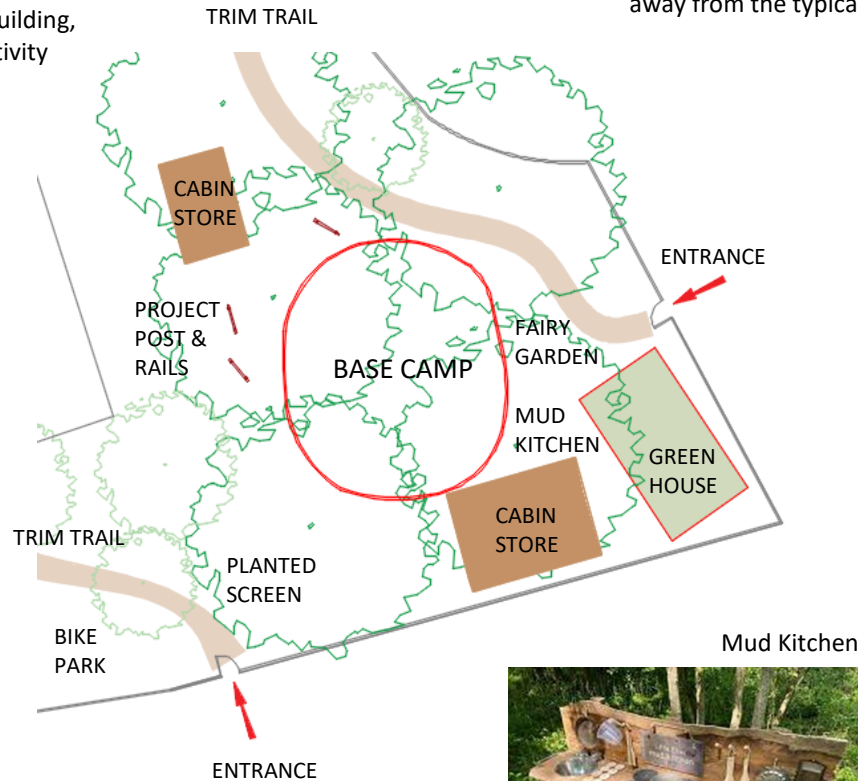
**Project Post & Rails** – aside from Den building, weaving and percussion frames, and activity posts can be scaled to KS1.



**Music Walls** – potential to utilise existing Cabin walls



**Fallen Trees** - Bike Park



**Upgrades** - Greenhouse, Fairy Garden, Work Benches and Mud Kitchen.



**Make an Entrance** – creating an arch or a secret route into the space makes it instantly feel like another place, away from the typical playground and the classroom.

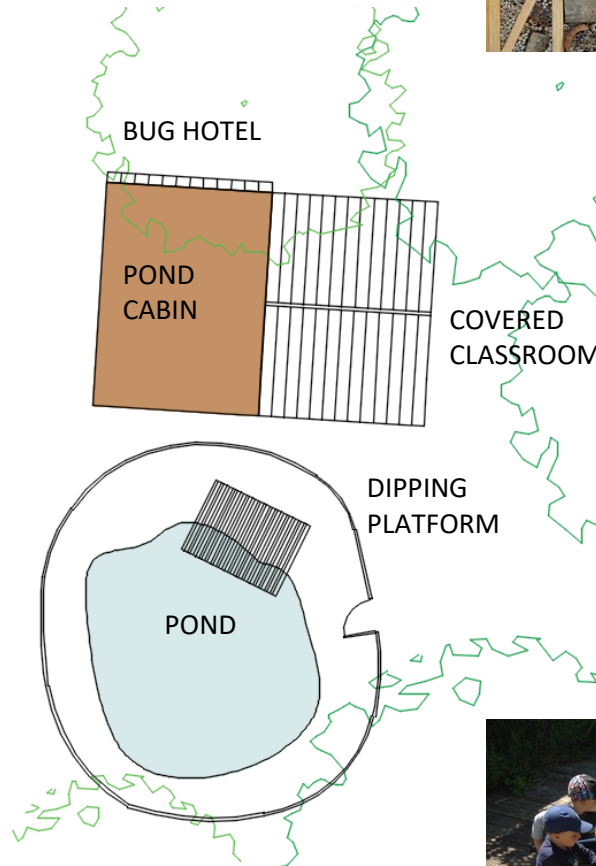

Bug Hotels on Cabin Gable Walls



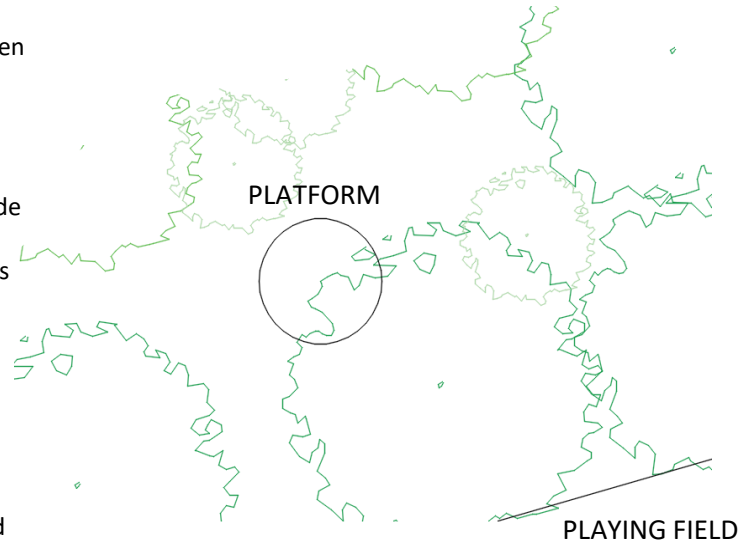

## Scaled Spaces and Places

The provision of different scaled spaces is seen as key to enabling and supporting different activities, both planned and unplanned.

### The Glade Platform

To the north of the site sited in a natural glade a platform is proposed, for larger groups, plays, shows, storytelling, yoga and tai chi. As well as providing a flat space for nature arts and crafts activities.



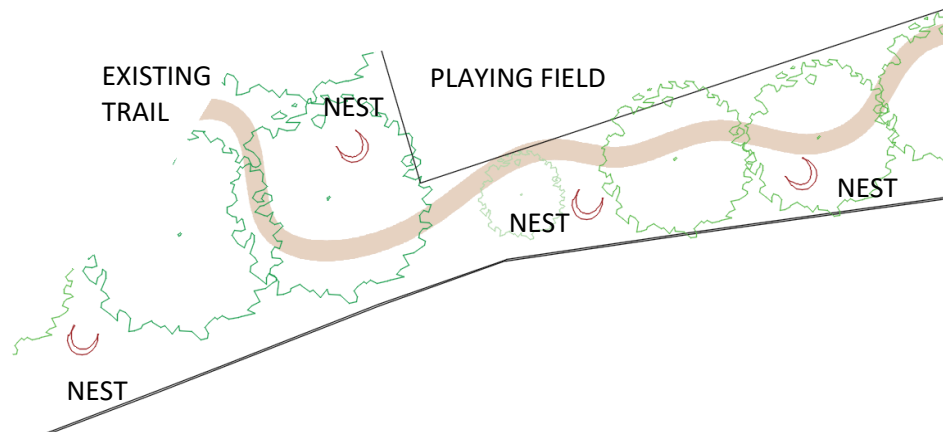
Glade Platform

### Small Group and Quiet Spaces

Contained to clusters along the southern perimeter, these multi-functional spaces and "nests" can be used alone for quiet time, or by small groups of friends at supervised playtimes, as well as for small group forest school activities.

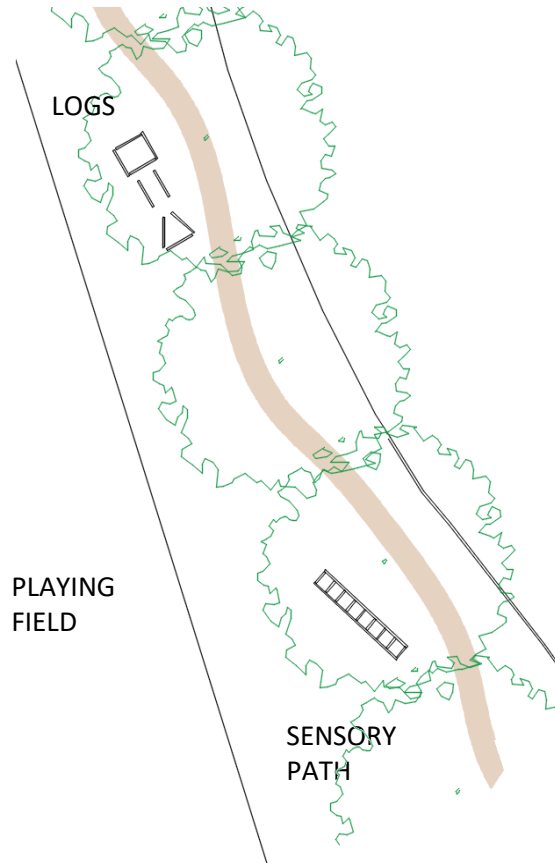

## Sensory Path & Movable Logs



Shapes & Balancing Beams



### Sensory Path

Children's anxiety and stress can increase during long periods in a classroom. A short break on a sensory path releases excessive energy levels and can calm an anxious child. The multi-activity sensory path and the physical movements help children to relax and return to class better enabled them to focus on learning.



Permanent or Temporary Found Objects



### Movable Logs

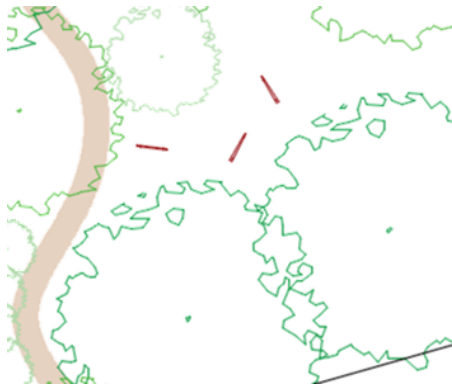
The children climb, balance, build and can construct shapes. They can discuss spacial terms such as inside, on, by, near, around, outside.. In the process the children work together, have conversations, and are working on gross motor skills, and keeping their imagination active.



## Multi-functional Posts & Frames Den Building / Music and Art

These multifunctional frames can be used any number of activities or projects. They can be used for den building, weaving frames, wind chimes, xylophones, percussion instruments, tyre swings etc

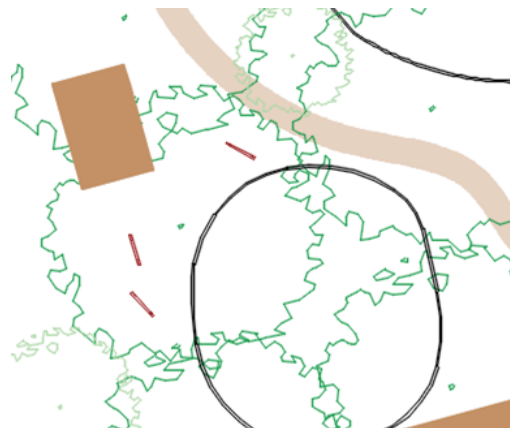
It is proposed that the frames are to be located in small clusters in three locations throughout the site. Each cluster could be scaled differently to suit key stage groups of children and / or age appropriate activities.

## Small Scale Interventions

Throughout the site, it is proposed that a series of small scale installations, interventions and artworks are placed to be discovered.

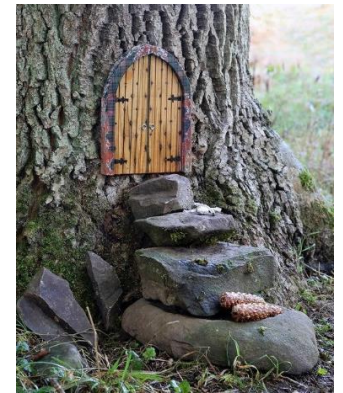
### Art & Storytelling

These sensitively placed interventions help to nurture a sense of discovery and contribute to place making for children to bond with their environment.



### Fairy Doors

Imagination at work. Random tiny doors placed around the space. Using imagination, the doors open to creatures and worlds beyond ours and the children's creativity and storytelling skills are enhanced.





## Small Scale Interventions

### Nature & Wildlife

Webcams are linked to nesting boxes, feeders & bug hotels.

Alongside creating denser boundaries using native hedgerow planting, wildflower planting in selected areas will encourage insects for observation.



### Nature & Physical Activities

Opportunities along the trim trail to introduce stepping stones, balance beams, jumps etc should be sought. Additionally, it is suggested that opportunities to span trees with balancing and climbing ropes and hammocks etc are identified.
