Topic and Science: Food and Farming




We have started our topic with a trip to Sprouts Farm. The children will experience what it is like to be a farmer and learn how a working farm runs. On our first visit we have met the pigs and talked about how they are looked after (including helping to feed them), learnt how the pigs are used to prepare the soil for planting, planted our crops and learnt how to harvest leaves. On our second visit we will learn how to look after the chickens and we will harvest our crops. These crops will then be on sale at our La Moye Farmer's Market after school. date to return to Sprouts will have to be changed and we will update you with the new date as soon as this has been confirmed.


In geography, we are learning about Jersey and the produce that is grown on the island. In history, we will learn what farms were like in the past and how they have changed over time. We will be visiting Hamptonne Country Life Museum so the children can look at real artefacts and the equipment they would have used compared to what is used now. In Design Technology, we will be learning about healthy diets and hygienic food preparation to make a range of predominantly savoury dishes.

English:



Our first text driver is Oliver's Vegetables this is a book about a child planting vegetables with their Grandparents. On each day of the week he tries a new vegetable and realises he likes more than just potato. To engage the children we will begin this journey trying lots of different vegetables and finding new ways to decribe them. We will use these adjectives to create expanded noun phrases to write a persuasive piece aiming to encourage younger children to eat more vegetables.



Our second text driver is Beast Feast! This is a charming story about a quick-thinking child and a soft-hearted beast, with letters to open. Beast has found a tasty dinner, and he's written to all his friends to invite them to a feast. Unfortunately, Dinner is a child who very much does not want to be eaten. We will be using this story to help us write a recipe for their own feast dish!




Please read with your child for 10 minutes 5 times a week. Please ensure that your child brings all books to school everyday.
