



# Nursery Autumn 2 Newsletter



Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you all had a restful break. The children have settled back into the Nursery routines well and we have a busy and exciting time planned for the next half term!

## Phonics & Literacy

In Nursery we will be focusing on sound discrimination activities this term which concentrates on developing children's speaking and listening skills. This lays the foundations for the phonic work which we will begin with the Read, Write, Inc program after Christmas. We will also be reading, talking about and answering questions about lots of stories and traditional tales.

Children will continue to practise writing their names by tracing them each morning. We will also be encouraging children to write some letters from their names during their play. Please practise name writing with your child at home throughout the term.

We will be continuing the Hampshire 'Text Drivers' approach this term. This will involve focusing on a high quality book and using it to develop speaking and listening skills while encouraging a passion for books and reading. The books we will be focusing on this half term are Room on the Broom, Little Red Riding Hood & The Tree that's Meant to Be.



The statements the children are being expected to achieve this term are:

- Anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories
- Listens to others and stories in small groups.
- Can answer simple questions
- Plays with rhyming words, alliteration and hears and says some letter sounds.
- Includes mark making and early writing in their play.
- Recognises and attempts to write some letters from their own name.

## Maths

This half term we will be continuing to practise our subitising, counting skills and number recognition to 10. We will be doing this mainly through play opportunities along with a short, daily carpet session.

The statements the children are being expected to achieve this term are:

- Links numerals to amounts up to 5 and beyond.
- Subitises one, two and three objects (without counting).
- Can count alongside actions in games, rhymes and songs.
- Begins to recognise numbers 0-10.



## Topic

This term we will be looking at a range of festivals and celebrations in Nursery. We will be learning about Bonfire Night, Remembrance Sunday, Advent and Christmas. It would be great if you could talk as a family at home about what you do to celebrate these occasions and how some families may celebrate in different ways.
