



Reception Spring 1 Newsletter



Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely, festive winter break! The children have settled back into the daily routine of Reception well and we are all looking forward to another busy fun filled half term!

We are focusing on Communication and Language over the first two weeks this term and we will be asking each child to talk about something they did in the Christmas holidays. It is really important that you put a photo on your child's Tapestry Learning Journey so they can share it with the class, whilst they talk.

Here is an outline of what we will be covering over the next few months.

RWI

This half term, we will be re-grouping the children for their daily RWInc lessons. All children will continue to practice blending and segmenting CVC words. Some children will begin taking books home or Ditty sheets (A4 reading sheet containing simple words and sentences).

Please continue to practise recalling all the sounds at home and blending sounds together to make simple words. Have a look at the website below where there is a lot of excellent videos.

Please also continue to focus on the correct letter formation with a good pencil grip with your children at home. We hope that you have found the letter formation files we have sent home useful.

We will continue to post weekly RWInc video via Tapestry please let us now if you are having problems accessing these.

The statements the children are being expected to achieve this term are



- Links sounds to letters when segmenting and blending CVC words
- Segments CVC words and use appropriate letters to represent sounds in their writing.

Maths

This half term we will recap numbers with a focus on conceptual and perceptual subitising to 10 both on and off a 10 frame. We will also be looking at 2D shapes and their properties and naming 3D shapes and the final week we will look at capacity.

It is important for children to develop a deep understanding of individual numbers to 10. This means that children should know different ways of making each number by recognising patterns in different arrays using a multitude of objects. To know that the value of it does not

change even if the position of the objects does (because nothing has been added or taken away). The children need to begin to understand different ways of making numbers up to 10. As well as counting (audio sounds, moving objects), ordering and recognising digits.

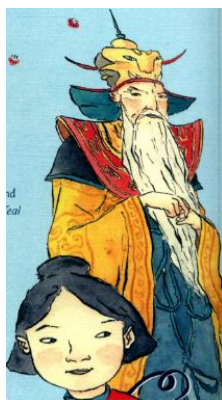
The statements the children are being expected to achieve this term are

- Engages in subitising numbers to four and maybe five.
- Shows awareness that numbers are made up (composed) of smaller numbers, exploring partitioning in different ways with a wide range of objects
- Begins to conceptually subitise larger numbers by subitising smaller groups within the number, e.g. sees six raisins on a plate as three and three
- Uses comparative language to describe and compare measures (size, weight, capacity and time)
- Explores characteristics of everyday objects, 2D and 3D shapes using Mathematical language to describe them.

Text Drivers – Focus Stories

This half term we are focusing on 3 different story books. Our first will be all about owls. The second is a traditional fairy tale and the third will be focusing on Chinese New Year.

Topic



This half term, we will be looking at Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day and animals and their habitats. For Chinese New Year, the children will be getting creative with Chinese Lanterns and dragons and will have the opportunity to eat some Chinese foods! National Storytelling week

begins on the 1st February. ❤️

The statements the children are being expected to achieve this term are

- Knows about festivals and celebrations that are marked within their own Culture.
- Talks about similarities and differences between themselves and others and among families' communities and traditions.
- Makes observations of animals and plants and explains why some things occur, and talks about changes
