



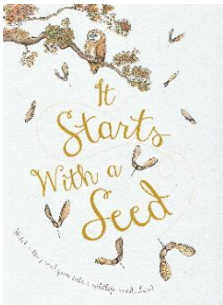
Spring 2 Newsletter

Welcome back. We hope you have had a restful and enjoyable half term break. We have outlined the outcomes for the next half term below.

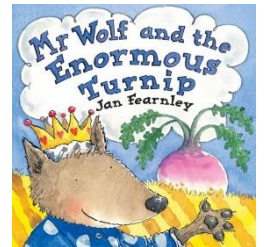
English



Our first focus text this half term is the poetry book *'It Starts with a Seed'*. Later we will read *'Mr Wolf and the Enormous Turnip.'*

Through our focus book *'It Starts with a Seed'* we will be learning and performing poetry before making pinned, spinning life cycles of an apple tree and then writing a non-chronological report about plants.

'Mr Wolf and the Enormous Turnip' focuses on a variety of traditional fairy tales, told in a different way. For example: 'Get some rest Sleeping Beauty!' and 'Snow White and the very angry Dwarf.' The children will be writing a diary entry from the point of view of one of the characters and re-writing a traditional tale themselves, with a few fun tweaks!



Teach Handwriting



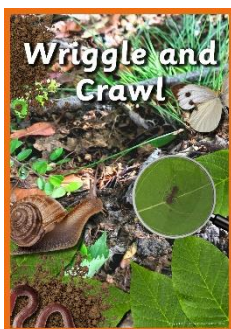
We are placing more emphasis on handwriting and presentation this term. We will continue to do handwriting sessions but will be looking more towards joins in their writing across all their lessons. This half term we will be learning about multiplication and division. The children will be learning what multiplication means, as well as learning multiplication facts.

Living Things



In this topic we will be looking at 'offspring' and what this means as well as the lifecycles of various animals and insects. We are very excited to be inspiring the children's learning by hatching some chicks and butterfly eggs. We will have them in our classrooms to make observations over time. We'll also head to our forest area to identify minibeasts in their natural habitat. Heading out into the local area, we'll explore trees and bushes to see what lives there and create a minibeast habitat of our own. We'll draw delicate sketches of minibeasts, make models from a variety of materials and observe minibeasts in their habitat.

PE

PSHE

The focus this half term is called 'Healthy Me'. This piece will include discussions about being healthy, being relaxed and healthy eating. We will also begin to learn about Digital literacy and how to keep safe when using devices.

The key question this half term is, 'Why does Easter matter to Christians?'

Forest School

We will be taking part in Forest school sessions on a Monday afternoon.

For these sessions, your child will need a change of clothes, including shoes/wellies, so that their uniform doesn't get mucky. These clothes should be older clothes that you don't mind getting dirty. If your child has an outdoor waterproof all in one puddle suit to wear than that is good to wear too! We will support the children to get changed into their Forest school clothes on a Monday afternoon. The children will leave school in their forest school clothes with their uniform in their bags.
